Ms Haverty's Class learned how to make winter wreaths. Erin tells us how it's done. Description: This is a winter wreath. It is made with different coloured leaves.

You will need:

Cardboard. Compass. Scissors. Paper.

Pencil. Paint. Glue. Ribbon. Cones.

A Paintbrush.

Method:

1. Paint the white paper in different colours.
2. When the paint dries, cut in the shape of leaves.
3. Draw a circle on the hard cardboard. Then draw another circle around the first circle about 3cm out from the first circle.
4. Cut out the circle in the middle of the wreath.
5. Glue the edge of the leaves to the wreath.
6. Arrange them in layers to overlap them.
7. Add some ribbon and cones and hang your wreath on your door.
