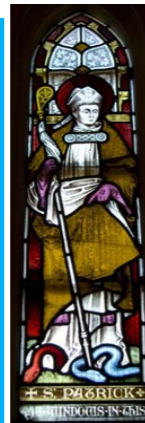

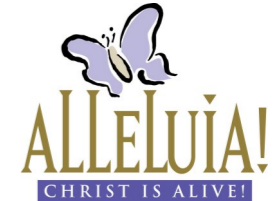
Welcome to the Easter edition of our Newsletter.
