

Trip to the Phoenix Park

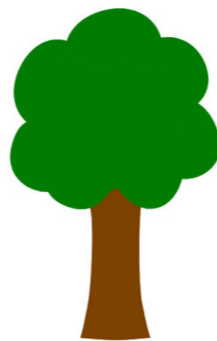

Mass to celebrate the new School Year

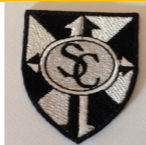

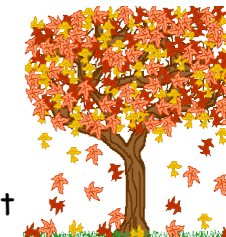
