Our newly formed camogie team travelled to Castleknock this week for their first match. Well done girls!

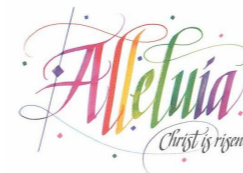

Oh I think that I found myself a litter bug, she is always right there when there's litter (x2)

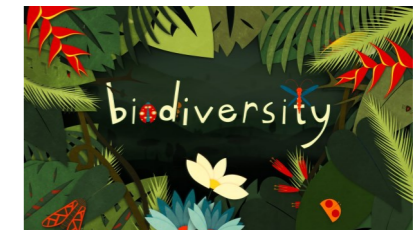
She looks like a bottle, she never listens when I tell her she's the problem, oh no.
